

Barnstable Police Press Release

On April 20, 2015 at approximately 8:30 p.m. Barnstable Police Officer Corey Frederickson responded to a report of a motor vehicle break-in at the FedEx Office Print & Ship Center on North St. in Hyannis. The victim told police that he was in the store for about ten minutes when he came out and found that several items were stolen from his work truck including a laptop, cell phone and bag of clothing. K9 Officer Jeffrey Jackson and his K9 partner Elvis tracked to the International Inn but were unable to locate the suspect.

Later that night at approximately 3:00 a.m. the victim was able to track the stolen phone using a mobile application on another device. Officers Maxwell Morrow and Spencer Jackson searched the International Inn using the tracking application. During their search for the stolen items Officer Morrow encountered a subject later identified as Allahmanamjad Barbel. Barbel had just exited the rear window of a room that he had broken into and was squatting in. Barbel dropped the stolen items and sprinted off towards Main St. After a lengthy foot pursuit Barbel was able to slip away and elude police for several days. With assistance from the Barnstable County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Unit, identifying evidence was collected in the hotel room that Barbel had broken into.

On April 27, 2015 Officer Bruce Marney located Barbel on Main St. in Hyannis and placed him under arrest. Barbel, a 27 year old homeless man, was charged with the following crimes: Breaking & Entering into a Motor Vehicle, Larceny of Property over \$250, Breaking & Entering into a Building and three counts of Receiving Stolen Property. Barbel was transported to Barnstable District Court for arraignment and ordered to be held in the Barnstable County House of Correction without bail as he was now in violation of the terms of his probation stemming from previous arrests.

The officers were able to recover all of the stolen property and return it promptly to the victim who was only in town for a couple days on business. The Barnstable Police would like to take this opportunity to remind all residents and visitors to lock their vehicles at all times when not in use.
